BobFest hits the road this year with East Coast performances in Atlantic City and Vermont but will be back home in Red Bank NJ on Monday May 18 to celebrate Bob Dylan's 68th birthday at the Two River Theater. The annual tribute, called '*Red Banks hippest tradition*' began ten years ago when Pat Guadagno celebrated Bob's birthday by singing a couple of Dylan songs to a small audience at Red Banks Downtown Cafe. The event celebrates its fourth year at the Two River Theater with Tired Horses Rich Oddo, Red River Rizzo, Rene Woolley, Yuri Turchin and Mary McCrink. This year's show will include Special Guests Marc Muller (*Shania Twain's band*) and Steve Delopolous (*Burlap To Cashmere*) as well as a very special appearance by Nashville Singer / Songwriter Daniel Petraitis

Guadagno's unique adaptations of other artist's music have been featured on Film and Television including the award winning Showtime Series **Californication** where Pat performs his version of Warren Zevon's '**Don't Let Us Get Sick**. Music from Pat's highly acclaimed "Live at the City Lights Saloon" can be heard on Sirius Satellite Radio where Guadagno's remake of The Hollies classic '**Bus Stop**' has become a coffee house favorite.

Acoustic Guitar World described Guadagno's rendition of Dylan's "All Along the Watchtower" as a "*showcase of guitar virtuosity*" Now Toronto Magazine writes "*what sets him apart is his refusal to perform songs in anything resembling their original style. His effortless intuitiveness gives old songs new meaning*". The Two River Times calls it "*an unflappable dedication to his craft which sets him apart from the rest of the pack*"

The Rock & Roll Music Fund sponsors the event from which proceeds will benefit the [Tony Guadagno Memorial Scholarship](#). The scholarship honors brother Tony's legacy by providing financial support for aspiring young New Jersey musicians attending Berklee College of Music in Boston. **Doors** open at 7PM with our Red Bank Neighbors at Jamions Food and Drink serving cocktails in the lobby. On hand to MC the festivities will be New Jersey's favorite (and largest DJ) **Big Joe Henry**. The show sells out every year, so promoter Tom Moog urges Bob fans to get their tickets early and promises "*Dylan like you have never heard before, a couple of surprises, a few cocktails and a lot of fun*".
